Ollie swims to butterfly bronze medal

Cupar and District swimmer, 14-year-old Oliver Carter, travelled to the Scottish National Open at the beginning of April.

The four day event, held at Tollcross International Swimming Centre in Glasgow, saw this talented swimmer enjoy medal success on the national stage.

Swimming as part of the Fife Performance Swimming Squad, under the coaching eye of interim head coach David Haig, Ollie started the weekend swimming the 100m and 400m freestyle where he set personal bests in both swims.

Ollie is an all-round swimmer and competed strongly in the 200m IM and the 100m backstroke races.

He then finished the weekend off swimming a

lifetime best in the final of the 100m butterfly, placing third to secure a bronze medal in this highly competitive and prestigious national meet.

Cupar and District lead coach, Mark Laing said: "Once again Ollie has produced top end swimming at a high level competition.

"He possesses an incredible level of determination to achieve his very best and whether he is training, working in the gym or preparing for events, he gives 100 per cent application.

"Ollie burst onto the national stage last June and since then he has quickly identified himself as one of the country's most talented young athletes and is a young man with a very bright future ahead of him."
