AGM Treasurers Report 6/7/10

The current set of accounts is for the 12 month period 01/04/09 to 31/03/10 and have been audited of which a signed copy is available in the accounts folder should anybody wish to see them.

General Account

As part of the ONB 4 year development plan it was agreed to use £20,000 of the counties capital over this period to fund Athlete Development, Coach Education, IT equipment and Officials/Volunteer Education. As at the 31/3/10 we have granted £11379.20 and £6154.12 has been claimed. The General account shows an excess of expenditure over income of £9839.28 which is £7099.54 more than the previous 12 months. This is primarily due to funding previously mentioned.

- County income down by just over £600 due to reduction in Swimwear sales and bank interest.
- Room Hire charge increased by £100, we are now being regularly invoiced.
- Sundry increased by £600 which is the donation towards CMK's Timing system.

Competition Account

The Competition account shows and increase of income over expenditure of £8174.96 which is £3172.76 more than the previous 12 months. The Championship income was up by some £4000 and expenditure up by £800. This increase was due to savings on the trophies and the unexpected reduced costs for Aqua vale.

The net fund available to the county including Creditors/Debtor is £30,616.25.

Write backs £285 & £500 2009 temple cowley

It was previously proposed that the clubs using Aqua Vale should fund the replacement PA. As mentioned by Aylesbury the ownership of the equipment, the County has already agreed to fund the cabling and permanent fixture of the speakers so it would make sense for the County to reimburse Maxwell for the new PA equipment and take ownership of the complete system. The new installation & replacement equipment should see several years of service so it will be free to use.

Finally I would like to thank Janet Smith for auditing the county accounts.

AGM Swimming Report 6/7/10

The County Championships concluded successfully with no major problems.

At the debrief meeting it was agreed to keep the format of the championships the same as 2010, with the exception of the 9-14 year Age group relays which will be moving. These were originally agreed to be held on the same day as the 1500/800m, but due Health & Safety regarding numbers of swimmers on the poolside these will now be split between the two long distance events. The Boys 9-14 Age Group relays will follow the 1500/800m and the Girls 9-14 Age Group relays will follow the 400m events. The only other change to the program of events is moving the 100m IM so that there is only a single 200m event in afternoon session for that gender.

Dates and Venues

A pre-requisite for the 1500m/800m events to be held at Stantonbury was that a copy of the pool length certificate or that Stantonbury pool is list on the ASA website measured pools. A copy of the pool certificate has now been obtained, unfortunately the pool has been designated as a manual timing pool only, as it will be to short with the timing pads in. There for the County can not hold any level 2 licensed meets there as AOE is required for level 2 meets. So the dates and venues for the 2011 County Championships are as follows:

4 session 1500/800m/9-14 Boys Age Group Relays

Sunday 20th February Aqua Vale

4 sessions 400m/9-14 Girls Age Group Relays

5th/6th March Aqua Vale 3 sessions Main 12th/13th March Aqua Vale 3 sessions Main

Closing date for entries is Monday 24th January 2011.

All Age Groups will be Age as at 13th March 2011.

All pools have been provisionally booked for the 2010 Championships and Licenses will be applied for during the summer.

Annual Report Synchronised Swimming

Over the past year there has been a big change in county synchronised swimming with a lot of experienced swimmers leaving the sport either through University or moving areas. We have been fortunate in welcoming a number of younger inexperienced swimmers and numbers of 12 & under swimmers are increasing.

Witney Synchro was therefore only able to send one swimmer, Louise Fuller, to the Multi regional Championships and to National Age group Championships. Louise swam well and gained podium finishes in both Championships.

The Christmas demonstration went well and we were glad to welcome the County President as a special guest on the day.

The Club has put on a small demonstration followed by an introduction to synchro class for the pupils at Headington Girls School. The Club would welcome opportunities for more such events at Schools, Clubs, leisure centres throughout the County.

The Club retained its Swim 21 accreditation in March and also welcomed several new committee members at it's AGM.

The British Championships were held in Gloucester with visiting Teams from China and Italy. Fifteen swimmers and several parents from the Club attended as spectators for the weekend and came away with new enthusiasm. Witney are aiming to take as many swimmers to National Age groups this year in December in Gloucester so this was good experience for the swimmers to become familiar with the venue.

Steve Fuller from Witney was the Executive Director of the event –a role he has been asked to repeat for the National Age groups this year.

Swimmers from the Club have recently attended competitions —some experiencing their first competitions. All swimmers have performed well and several medals and trophies won. (See achievements sheet). Two Witney swimmers attended the British Masters Championships in Telford and Louise Fuller gained third place. (Louise is currently at university in Birmingham but has managed to fit training around course work)

Several members of Witney attended a Scorer's course and Exam but are still awaiting results. Two coaches attended the Sports Coaches and Volunteers conference at Brookes recently.

OFFICIALS SEC: REPORT JULY 6th 2010

The number of new officials is progressing very nicely, since the last AGM we have 81 new officials – 20 JL1 plus 8 still to do final assessment, between CMK, Maxwell, Newport Pagnell, Bicester, Aylesbury and 61 timekeepers between Maxwell, Newport Pagnell, Buckingham, Bicester, Aylesbury, Bletchley and Witney that I know of, however, there could be more new officials who have taken courses outside of the county who I have not been informed of either by the clubs concerned or the ASA / British Swimming, yet again.

I am shortly stating another JL1 course and a JL2 course both well subscribed. Plus we have candidates on the Referee's course (which takes 12 months).

It would appear that some people are under the impression that because of what happened at the distance events this year, we the County, are very short of officials, we are not.

To date with the new officials we have over 240 registered officials in the County but, I may regret saying this, we therefore, are not short of officials but we do have a very big problem getting people to officiate when required, we still have to rely on the same old faces at major events.

This year, at the Counties, we were placed in the position of possibly having to cancel the 800/1500m events due to lack of officials prepared to officiate, in the end enough people did come forward to help but over half of the officials who attended did not have a child swimming and some travelled over 40 miles each way to help – they turned out for the good of the sport and the County to enable the swimmers to compete – for that I am indebted to them – thank you.

The remainder of the Championships ran very smoothly with adequate numbers of officials and back room staff, without whom we just cannot operate, albeit some officials had some very strange ideas of what officiating at the County Championships is all about, yes you are expected to time keep for the whole session not just the events/heats your child is swimming in – again to them a very big thank you to all.

The above said, due to meet licensing criteria changing we may have to change our outlook on how officials are obtained for the various competitions.

A possibility is that each club entering the County Championships will have to undertake to provide a minimum number of officials per gala – per day - suggestion being 1 T/K and 1 Judge from each club for 2011Championships after that it changes again.

May I remind event organisers that as from September 1st 2010 at Level 2 meets all judges have to be licensed and from September 1st 2011 the minimum qualification for all officials at Level 2 meets will be Licensed Judge Level 1 (no timekeepers).

Also 100m events for 9yr old swimmers are not permitted, except 4 x 25m individual medley. [as per Open Meet Licensing Guidelines]

Please note I do not make the rulings just expected to implement them.

Facilities Officer's Report

After receiving a grant of £250K the changing area at Stantonbury has been upgraded. There is an issue with the measurement of the pool which is being investigated.

At a cost of £21M the Bletchley leisure centre opened in January 2010 and both CMKSC and Bletchley and District SC have pool time there. The venue recently received an environmental award for sustainable design.

Wolverton outdoor pool remains open for another summer, there continues to be conflicting reports as to what is happening with the new pool project.

There are plans to invest in Aqua Vale, mainly in the changing rooms, café and reception, details and start dates as yet unknown.

A decision on the future of the Temple Cowley Pools and Blackbird Leys pool is to be made on 12th July.

No other significant changes reported.

This has been another year of achievement for our disability swimmers. The most notable being the British Record that Lucy Chenery of Maxwell achieved in the 800m freestyle at the County Championships in February. Well Done Lucy. We now have two swimmers from the County on the National Talent program for disability swimming. They are Rosie Bancroft (COSC), now in her third year, and Amy Hursthouse (Maxwell) who is new to the program. Rosie has also been selected to represent England East in the UK School Games that are taking place in Sunderland at the beginning of September. Lucy, Rosie and Christopher Currie have all achieved qualifying times for the Disability Swimming National Championships that are taking place in Sunderland along side the able-bodied Nationals.

Once again we didn't see many disability swimmers at the County Championships this year because of the clash with the DSE Junior championships. Hopefully, the appointment of John Atkinson as the National Performance Director for British Disability Swimming will rectify this in the future as he is planning to bring disability swimming more in line with able-bodied swimming. He has already made some sweeping changes to the National Podium and Development programs.

Kirstie Jackson, the SER Disability Development Coach has been working hard in our area recently. There was a regional talent day at Stoke Mandeville on Sunday 4th July and a number of our swimmers were invited to attend. I have been invited to attend a County Assessment Day on Wednesday 7th July at the University pool in Oxford. Kirstie has been working with some young swimmers from Oxfordshire schools on Saturday afternoons at Radley College and they are going to be assessed on Wednesday morning with a view to introducing them to local clubs.

We only have a small number of disability swimmers in the County at present but those that we do have are making great strides within the sport. Hopefully, that will inspire other young swimmers with a disability to come forward and enjoy competitive swimming.
