After 6 months of investigation into potential security arrangements it was agreed that , unless there are spare DBS checked volunteers available to be allocated , no additional arrangements will be made to the security/patrolling of the changing village at Aqua Vale during the Champs. An idea of a uniformed presence had been rejected by the Centre. Maxwell reported that they do nothing extra during their regular events there. Helen Mack reported that she has looked at other Counties's arrangements for the same type of facility and no arrangements are put in place beyond the Centre's own. It was generally agreed that no arrangements would combat someone intent on committing what occurred at the 2015 Champs. It is incumbent on all Clubs to ensure that their swimmers change in pairs and be vigilant. Aqua Vale has increased the number of cameras and have promised to patrol the changing village.

There were some outstanding performances at the SER Short Course Champs held at Portsmouth on the 7th/8th November. Suffice to say 13 County Junior and Open Records were broken over the weekend which mid-cycle is exceptional.

I would also like to wish our synchro swimmers the best of luck competing at the National Championships at Gloucester at the beginning of December.

There has been an issue over the past 10 years or so with getting deserving volunteers to accept the position of County President. I suspect it is because they do not want to commit to attending all our Executive Meetings and also, more relevantly, Chair those meetings. I am therefore going to propose that we investigate amending the constitution whereby a Chairman is elected for the Association who will obviously, amongst other responsibilities Chair the meetings. That will release the President to a purely ceremonial role, visiting the various disciplines, presenting at the County Championships etc etc. I hope that will make it easier for Clubs to find deserving long serving volunteers to accept their nomination.

As it was the 1st time over night, I gathered feedback from swimmers and staff and parents.

In summary, overall experience was very good.

Accommodation: the hotel staff looked after the group well and responded to all our requests.

I had asked for us all to be on one floor or all girls on one and all boys on another. However, when we checked in we had been allocated 3 floors. Some swimmers were inconvenienced with the wrong combination of beds though this was in part due to last minute room 'share' changes as well as the hotel's mistake of giving us 3 floors. None the less, the rooms were excellent and eventually all was resolved.

<u>Evening meal</u>: food was plentiful and without chips. I have now been able to identify a closed section of the dining area that we could use next time, so we can, in fact, carry out team activities without disturbing other guests. The hotel staff were good at accommodating our late arrivals (namely those from CMK) who had been competing till late that Saturday night and still needed to eat.

Breakfast was standard fair and available early enough to suit all needs.

<u>Sunday lunch</u> was however, hit and miss – some swimmers not seeming to have enough cash or making time to obtain something decent from the café to see them through. Hence there was a stop off at an M&S on the way home.

<u>Transport</u>: the coach and driver were exceptional and made the event the success it was. The driver Paul Gilbert was flexible and supportive to all our needs including making the unscheduled stop off on the return journey to enable swimmers to buy more food. DVDs for part of the journey seemed to work as a bonding session turning into a sing

song session, particularly on the outward journey.

Specific feedback from Swimmers/Parents:

Mostly positive points, the main one being that they felt it was well organised. Some suggestions for improvement that are in our control have been noted eg. availability of hoodies, more team bonding activities in the evening.

Parents were overwhelming in their support of the weekend. They expressed their swimmers excitement, especially from the younger ones as this was a big event for them. Emails of thanks and positive feedback were received. At least no complaints!

The Sunday performance was worth the extra overnight. It was felt that there was less stress and tiredness from travelling up on the 1 day. We did have 1 parent go to the wrong services and missed the pick up time by 20mins. Had this happened on the Sunday we would have had some scheduling problems! Admittedly this was the 1st time I have experienced a late arrival in all the years I have been going to this event.

An unexpected bonus was the costs of the weekend were reduced by a successful application to the ASA for a £1000 reimbursement towards accommodation costs.

Costs this year therefore were:

£1095 (coach and driver)

£1989 (Hotel)

Total £3084 and less the ASA reimbursement: £2084

The main proposed changes should we repeat the experience in 2016:

- 1. Start the camp sooner and leave earlier for a pool stop off en route to Sheffield on the Saturday and have a 'training/bonding' session in the water. Maximum costs could be £15 per hour per lane. We would need 4 lanes, and 2 hours = £120 at the most. Further on costs would be the driver/coach's extra time.
- 2. Ask CMK/NPG swimmers (who make the County team) not to compete in the Lincoln Vulcans Meet on the Saturday in order to be involved in the full weekend. The bonus would be that swimmers from those clubs would be much fresher for the Sunday competition.
- 3. Offer a sweat top as part of the kit. The upside is the obvious 'team' feel it engenders but also it makes swimmers more easily identifiable. I have obtained a quote for a non-zip version of £15 (+VAT) fully printed. Swimmers could purchase this at cost?
- 4. Take up the option of buying a prepared packed lunch £5.95 per head (available from the Holiday Inn) for the swimmers on the Sunday (x34 = £202)

I would like to thank Chantal Clavaud and Andy Willis for all their help organising and managing the swimmers so well. Their support and experience was invaluable.

Thanks too to, Craig Oliver for stepping into County Coach role fairly late in the day as Kyle Frantzeskou was unable to attend the event due to personal circumstances.

Special mention to Brian Murphy for being our Official on behalf of ONB. Next year we will need to provide 2 officials.

Our Captains, David Murphy and Shannon Motha did an excellent job of representing ONB poolside with the ONB banner in the Opening Ceremony and indeed, they played a very supportive role the ensuring younger swimmers were settled.

NOVEMBER 2015

Since last meeting Witney Synchro attended the Multiregional Age Groups Competition held at the Olympic Stadium. This event is held with London, South West and South East. Six swimmers competed in figures -5 being 12 and under and 1 in the 13/14/15 age group. (Full results being at the end of the report). Two twelve and under swimmers swam their solos and then combined to swim Duet which was placed 3rd in SE region. The Team of 5 swam well and were placed 3rd in the SE region. (In this competitive event all the swimmers figure marks go forwards as an average to the overall Routine mark. Also the teams lose 0.5 marks per swimmer less than 8 – this meant that the Witney Team were 1.5 marks down before they started the event).

This Witney Team are competing again at the National Age Groups in December along with 3 Witney Combination Teams. This is the first time Witney will have a Team in the Competitive Strand.

Steve Fuller is Referee for the National Age Groups and I will be the Club National Judge for the event. At all National events each Club now have to supply a national judge and an ASA member volunteer for each day of competition. This is causing some problems for some Clubs who are having to "borrow" judges -recently at the Synchro Masters Competition I was nominated judge for Brighton Dolphins.

Henley Synchro competed at the Kent Open Competition –results at end of report. Henley will also be competing at the National Age Groups in December.

At present there is nil else to report. A full report of NAG's will be in the January report.

Officials' Secretary Report to the Executive 24th November 2015

Courses

We continue to deliver a number of courses within the County. All have been well subscribed with most J1 courses being full. It is pleasing to see a number progressing towards J2 and J2S, which should lead to a very healthy complement of officials in the future. A FINA update course was also delivered at Kidlington earlier this month. I am conscious that we do not have another FINA update planned and will give this some attention in the New Year. As always, details of this and other courses will be on the web site.

Given the number of officials in training, I repeat my message regarding mentoring that was included in my September 2015 report.

County Co-ordinators Conference

The ASA held a conference in Loughborough for County Co-ordinators in October. More detailed notes of the meeting are attached as an Appendix to this report. The topics covered were

- Training of referees
- Replacement programme for FINA and Pre-FINA referees and starters
- Training of officials at J1 and J2/J2S
- Pre referee training for qualified J2S
- · Accreditation of officials from other countries.

The conference was highly informative and highlighted the inadequacies of the current dissemination process through Regional Co-ordinators; a point I raised with the Swimming Officials Group. I was reassured, however, that the training structure in place within Oxfordshire and North Buckinghamshire was more than compliant with proposals made at the meeting and, in some cases, in advance of current thinking.

County Championship 2016

Requests for officials have already been sent out and I thank those who have made early returns to Sandra, who is coordinating the responses for the first time. Given the short period between Christmas and the first gala in January, I would encourage those able to volunteer to contact Sandra as soon as possible. I am particularly anxious we have a good attendance for the 800/1500 event on 10th January and the 400s on the 17th January. In previous years, we have relied heavily on officials who have not had children swimming to cover these events and I am conscious that many of these have not re-licenced.

I have been asked about the availability of mentoring opportunities at the County Championships. I will be organising this and we will be sending out information in advance of the events. My first priority will be to run the galas with a full complement of officials. Once this is completed, I will look at the opportunities for mentoring. I am not planning to run any assessments at the Counties.
