SWIMMING SECRETARY REPORT & CHAMPIONSHIP CONSIDERATIONS-May 2022

The ONB Counties ASA Championships 2022 debrief was held on April 12. Six clubs submit feedback to the Swimming Secretary for review and consideration. Representatives from Aylesbury, Four Shires, Maxwell, Newport Pagnell, Witney & ONB Counties were present. Apologies received from Milton Keynes

The following were considered when reviewing the 2022 championships: general feedback received pre, during and post the Championships, written feedback from member clubs and those in attendance.

While the overwhelming sentiment of the feedback was positive, the feedback can be categorised into the following topics for consideration:

- a. Qualifying Criteria & Finale
- b. Medals, Trophies & Presentations
- c. Refreshments & Catering
- d. Meet conditions and additions
- e. Officials
- f. Other items

Summary of each topic for consideration

QUALIFYING CRITERIA & FINALS – The feedback requested the entry criteria be reviewed as the gap between the number of girls' and boys' entries continue to grow year on year, coupled with the continuation of the issue whereby less than eight swimmers compete in each event final (25 finals were not full vs 20 in 2020)

- Recommendations-Discontinue using the 2009 A & B grade times as a benchmark, favouring a more current standard drawn from the British Rankings as at the closing date for entry into the National Championships. (In this year's case, May 08, 2022.) From this, both the guaranteed accepted and considered times will be derived, applying the same discount to all ages and gender by stroke.
- Oliver & Sharon will draft the entry time based on these criteria for 2023 and refer it to the committee for consideration.

MEDAL, TROPHIES & PRESENTATIONS – 2022 should be considered an exception due to the late appointment of the Trophy Secretary, which led to the late ordering of both medals and trophies. The lateness of this appointment due to a lack of volunteers limited the medal and trophy options available. Ayako did an exceptional job procuring the medals and

trophies in such a limited timeframe. The feedback relates to the quality of the medals and the size differential between the Junior and Championships Trophies. It was also proposed that medal ceremonies occur at stages throughout the finals. However, it was felt that based on the lack of space poolside and that swimmers often compete in multiple events, this could cause delays and challenges processing swimmers through marshalling as required in the meet conditions.

• Recommendations

- Ayako to purchase bespoke medals in advance, similar to those used by Maxwell and Oxford Swim clubs. Designs to be approved by the Swimming Secretary.
- Trophies for 2023 to be sized accordingly, i.e. Junior Championship trophies to be easily differentiated by size from the Championship trophies.
- Presentation backdrop to be purchased; this was shelved ahead of the 2022 championships for budgetary reasons.

CATERING & REFRESHMENTS – Feedback was broadly positive. However, a request was made to include catering at the 400s and the main weekends of competition for Head Coaches. Some coaches and officials missed out on being offered refreshments during the competition.

Recommendations

- Volunteer to briefed to ensure all volunteers, officials and coaches are offered competition refreshments
- Catering for coaches at the 400s to be included

MEET CONDITIONS - Apparently, there was some confusion amongst parents as to the swim-off arrangement and the difference between swim-offs in the 50m & 100m vs 200m events

Recommendations

Swim-off criteria to be updated and included

OFFICIALS – The number of trainees officiating on the pool deck was raised as a concern, and it may have led to inconsistency and clashes.

Recommendation – Some of the challenge encountered was partly due to a; the low number of qualified officials volunteering, b; the lowered Swim England Officials criteria for L2 meet and c; the new officials' training regime. The lowered criteria has already reverted to pre-pandemic norms.

Other proposals:

Meet Mobile: The promoter will endeavour to update meet mobile more frequently, although it is unlikely this will be run live.

Entry Payments: It is proposed that payment of entries by clubs will not be required until two weeks after issuing accepted entries, plus a prepayment of circa 2% of the entry fee in lieu of any fines. Non-payment by the given deadline will result in that clubs entries being withdrawn.

Relays: It was proposed that relays return to a maximum of two per club.

Fees: It was proposed that swimmer entry fees for individual events remain unchanged and that relay entry fees increase to £10.00 per team entered.

Spectator Fees: It was proposed that spectator fees increase to £6.00 per session and £10.00 for the full day (Up from £4 & £8). No charge for the final session of each of the main championships. This was proposed to offset the Aqua Vale £3460.00 increase in pool hire costs.

Programme: The promoter is to consider the implementation of Mixed Open relays in the 2023 programme permitted. It is proposed that these could be added to the 400's sessions.

2023 Championships dates: Saturday, January 07 – Leys Pool (Oxford) 1500m Freestyle & Boy Age Group Relays 10-1-12 & 13-14

Saturday, January 14 – Leys Pool (Oxford) 800m Freestyle & Girls Age Group Relays 10-11-12 & 13-14

January 21 – Aqua Vale (Aylesbury) 400m events

4th/5th & 11th/12th February – Aqua Vale (Aylesbury) Main Championships

Qualifying Period: February 14 2022, to December 04 2022 (all events, including long distances)

Entries: The closing date for entries is December 07 2022

Merchandise: Swim Hats to include the year and are proposed to be on a pre-order basis only.

General comments:

A second new Trophy Secretary is needed ahead of the 2023 Championships to manage the returnable/re-issued trophies.

Swim meet technology at Oxford Leys needs to be bought up to an acceptable standard in keeping with the championships.

The outgoing and incoming promoters to review roles and responsibilities with clubs being allocated specific pre-competition duties to lighten the load on the promoter/swimming secretary.

O&NB County Artistic Swimming Report

May 2022

At the beginning of April four athletes from Oxford & Witney Artistic Swimming Club attended the National Age Groups Championships in Gloucester. Overall numbers of athletes gaining entry grade qualifications are still moderate due to the opportunity limitations due to Covid-19. but 130 athletes attended from all over the country.

Athletes coped well with the pressures of this level of competition and OWASC results are shown below.

At the end of April two Junior OWASC athletes. Katherine Stevenson and Kata Soros attended the National Championships in Nottingham, performing Technical Solo and Duet. These were their first routines performed in over two years and they enjoyed the experience and executed their technical elements without penalties. Katherine coming 9th in Junior Solo and the Duet coming 8th in the overall Championships (4th in Juniors).

Mandy & Steve Fuller also attended as Judges at both events.

Permission was gained for the cancelled regional grade assessment day in February to be held as a virtual one. The regions coaches and judges worked extremely hard to give their athletes a further opportunity to gain their grades.

OWASC had successfully passed their Swim Mark health Check.

Two athletes from Oxford and Witney will be part of the South East Regional Squad in the inaugural Regional Games to be held in Bristol on June 3^{rd} .

Club athletes and officials are looking forward to a busy few months of competition culminating in the National Combo Cup on 2nd July at the London Aquatics Centre.

Officials' Report May 2022

31st March saw the end of the 'old' style J1 training regime, anyone who started their training under this will now have to complete the 'new' training from the start.

There has been an increase in the number of hours required post qualification for J1 and J2 before officials can commence the next level of training from 15 to 20 hours in existing role.

We have received updated information regarding Certificate of Exception which is the replacement for the current Certificate of Swimming Disability.

Swimwear guidance has been issued and includes information about period wear.

Swim England are trying to recruit more officials for Open Water as there is a national shortage, training courses are to be run over zoom and interested parties should contact: carol david butler@tiscali.co.uk

I was disappointed to see that there were no mentoring opportunities for J1 trainees at regionals especially as there is a requirement for experience at J1/J2 level. However, I acknowledge that the organisers struggled to get enough qualified officials and am aware that some sessions were in danger of not meeting the licencing conditions due to lack of numbers. This is disappointing to see even at a regional level competition and thanks go to all those ONB officials who did assist.

ONB Disabilities Report May 2022

Regional Training took place on the 16th April in Crawley. The next session is due to take place on 10th July at ACS International School in Cobham. Please remember it is essential that swimmers looking for classification attend the regional training sessions to have their skills signed off before they can be put forward to be classified.

On the 8th May there is an online event being run for any para swimmers not on a talent pathway programme being run by Carl Cooper and his team.

SER championships incorporating the Para swimmers took place at Wycombe over the bank holiday weekend. ONB had 1 representative who had a successful competition placing 2nd in 4 of her 5 events and 1st in the final event picking up 2 SER S8/SM8 regional records.

The next competition on the calendar for junior para swimmers is the National Junior Para Swimming Championships on 18th-19th June. For any one with qualifying times the Summer Home Nations events will follow. British Swimming are yet to publish para criteria for entry into the British Summer Championships.

I hope to be able to give some information about a regional para competition soon.

Role of the Counties

Purpose

The purpose of this paper is to outline a possible way forward for defining the role of the counties and the relationship with Regions and Swim England.

Discussion

The regional chairs have raised the issue of the role and purpose of the counties and whether this needs to be better defined to support effective delivery of the sport.

A group of six regional chairs met with George Wood and Claire Coleman to discuss this matter and explore it further. The meeting sought to answer six key questions:

- 1 Do we all believe there is a need for a sub-regional structure and are counties the right format for this?
- 2 Can we work together to construct a fact-base on the current position regarding counties so we are operating from a shared understanding and how should we consult with counties?
- 3 Do we have initial headline ideas of what sub-regions / counties should be doing? (are there mandatory and optional roles for counties)
- 4 How should National and Regional be managing / working with the counties?
- 5 What governance standards should we expect of the counties?
- 6 What timeline should we work to with this project?

The conversation amongst the group demonstrated that there are different experiences across the regions with some feeling that their counties are effective with well-defined roles and others experiencing greater challenges. In terms of answering the six key questions, the answers were as follows (not all were unanimous):

- 1 We do need a sub-regional structure for sport and counties can provide this but we need to work with them and get them aligned to delivering effectively towards the national and regional direction of travel.
- 2 We need to construct a fact-base to understand the current position and this will require national and regional input to gain an accurate picture.
- 3 We discussed the following areas of county activity:
 - Competition all counties should deliver swimming competition. They should deliver competition for other disciplines where they have a critical mass of clubs / athletes.

- Welfare officers all counties should have welfare officers to support welfare activity across the sport.
- Governance There were varying opinions as to whether counties should play a role in governance (e.g. local dispute resolution).
- Swimming development There was general agreement that counties should play a role in sport development for swimming. It was felt more appropriate that this sits at regional level for other disciplines.

It was agreed that there should be a model county constitution that reflects their governance and functions.

- 4 It was agreed that it is a regional responsibility to govern the counties, this should be reflected in constitutions and / or the regional agreement. There should be a memorandum of understanding (MOU) between the region and the county that defines roles and responsibilities.
- 5 It was agreed that counties should adhere to a relevant level of governance standard. The first step of this may be a form of Stronger Affiliation before stepping up to achieve the first level of the Governance Code.
- 6 A timeline for action is outlined in the section below.

Way forward

A way forward is outlined below – it will be very important that this is driven in partnership between Swim England nationally and the Regional Chairs. It will be important to consider the implications of these actions and cost / benefit as part of the discussion:

1. Agreed communication made available to counties to ensure awareness and transparency.

Action: Claire Coleman by 4 April 2022.

- Create the Fact base, analyse results and share outcomes
 Action: Claire Coleman / Development Team Administrator / Regional Chairs.
 Drafted by 30 April 2022. Launched by 10 May 2022. Close by 31 May 2022
- 3. A standard model constitution to be developed for counties (this should reference all disciplines).

Action: Helen Weeks (via Claire Coleman). Model completed by: 30 June 2022. Adopted by all counties by the 31 December 2022

- A standard MOU between regions and counties should be developed that reflects roles and the priorities of the national and regional strategy.
 Action: Claire Coleman / Regional Chairs. Completed by: 30 June 2022
- 5. The MOU should be implemented between Regions and Counties **Action**: Regional Chairs. Completed by: 31 December 2022
- 6. Option 1 (two-step process) A County Affiliation standard should be developed for all counties to achieve in 2023 at the latest this is a stepping stone towards achievement of Tier 1 of the UK Sports Governance Code during 2024.

Option 2 – (one-step process) An audit against Tier 1 of the UK Sport Governance Code takes place in 2022 and then progression towards achieving the standard by end of 2023.

Action: Helen Weeks (via Claire Coleman).

7. Identification of resource requirement to deliver this programme effectively and consistently.

Action: Claire Coleman by 30 June 2022



ONB Meeting - May 2022

Constitutions

Swim England's model club constitution for unincorporated clubs has been updated and will now become recommended for use by clubs from January 2022.

South East Region Clubs will not be required to adopt the new constitution until their next constitution check is due. This needs to be completed every 4 years. Any club implementing other changes to their constitution, outside of their 4 year check, should adopt the new constitution at the same time as implementing those changes. New clubs looking to affiliate will need to use the new constitution from now onwards.

Swim Mark

Congratulations to Oxford and Witney artistic SC for maintaining their SwimMark at the April panel meeting. The clubs due to complete this quarter are Abingdon Vale, City of Oxford, Maxwell and Thame SC.

Open Water Technical Officials Training - Expression of Interest

The Regional Open Water Group hope to run an Open Water Officials Training course later this year. An online course is currently being piloted and it is hoped that this will be ready by the summer.

Candidates are not required to have Officials experience to take part in the training however you will need to be prepared to travel to other Regions in order to get experience of the roles such as Timekeeper, Turning Judge, Place Judge, Clerk of the Course, in order to complete the course.
