Coronavirus Safety Guidelines

Putteridge Swimming Club are working closely with the venue operator, Active Luton, to ensure the Spring Long Course National Qualifier 2022 event is delivered in line with the current Government, Swim England and Venue Operator guidelines and robust risk assessments have been developed and agreed.

We appreciate and acknowledge that restrictions in England have been lifted by the government, but we do still ask for attendees to edge on the side of caution regarding Covid, especially as this is the first open meet to take place at Inspire that permits spectators.

The safety of all competitors, spectators, team staff and workforce are paramount and therefore this competition will aim to retain precautions as a duty of care for all involved.

The guidelines that follow are intended to mitigate the transmission risk of Covid-19 and safeguard those attending this year's open meet.

If you are planning on attending our Spring Long Course National Qualifier 2022, we advise that the following precautionary measures are followed:

Competitors, Coaches, Team Managers and Spectators

- A lateral flow test within 24 hours of coming to the venue is advised to confirm you are not Covid positive.
- Upon arrival, please follow the directional and informative signage.
- Individuals are encouraged to wear a face covering when not competing and when moving around the venue, especially when in enclosed or congested areas where distancing cannot be achieved.
- Hand sanitising stations will be available throughout the venue, and we kindly ask that you regularly use them.
- Any belongings brought into the venue are the responsibility of the owner. PSC and the venue operator do not accept responsibility for any items that are lost, damaged or stolen.
- We advise all competitors to leave the venue as soon as possible once your events have been completed. This is to reduce the number of people in the pool hall at any one time.
