Additional notes

- We would like to see, over the next 3/4 months - the Constitution re drafted to reflect the important role of the Network Clubs, a restructuring of the Committee and a clear narrative and financial plan for the next 4 years (using the disciplines of SWIM 21)

- ***Any commitments should be proportional to the size of the network club. It would seem unfair to expect the same commitment (in terms of time and finance) from a small club like ours when there are several much bigger clubs in the area who will have a wider pool of resources.***
- We discussed this letter at our committee on Wednesday 24th Feb. I had one idea to help boost income for Aquae Sulis. Give the option for each club in turn to use some pool time. So we could come with our own swimmers and use a section of time used at the moment by Aquae Sulis. A week on week rolling option. So week one is open to Warminster week two for Frome ect. A point were we could bring our own swimmers and have our own coach's. If you decide to do a performance only squad the development session on a Sunday would be open to use, for example. Charge each club £50 per week for 12 network clubs that £600 per 12 weeks income over a 48 week period £2400 or charge more. If each club use it once every 12 weeks £100 per time is not a massive impact on the club but the income for yourself would be £4800 at £100 per session.
- We have attached your budget and added an option 3, which presents a more sustainable model with a Regional/National squad of 70, keeping the Elite group at 25, which is at the level of the British Swimming model, but increasing the second squad to 45 and running this as a lead into the Elite group so with slightly higher lane numbers.
- TASC has looked at the financial model provided alongside this questionnaire and we appreciate the openness. We estimate in this model that if you increase the swimmers to approximately 85, and you perhaps push for slightly more efficient pool hire, you already reach 'break-even' point. Therefore, TASC believes that AS should be an elite performance club offering place to the top 85 (or whatever final sustainable number is). These top 85 are chosen purely on their talent and potential as identified by the AS Head Coach and by the Head Coach of the relevant Network Club. They should not be chosen because they do not have enough pool time or coaching staff at their home club, unless the AS Head Coach recognises that with a better pool time a certain swimmer genuinely has potential.
- Development Camps quarterly if Development sessions cease, (our coaches may be able to offer support).
- Network Funding is provided by Somerset ASA, not sure if this is matched by Wiltshire ASA, if not this avenue of funding should be pursued considering the number of Wiltshire affiliated clubs.
