Level X Racing - Officials

Officials Requirements & Responsibilities

Level X Racing is a concept that enables swim times registered during a normal club training sessions to be entered into a national ranking system. It is a single club event, therefore not a competition, but a training activity. It has been designed to be a fun opportunity for swimmers, it is unlicensed and has minimal requirements regarding officials.

The table below outlines the minimum official requirements for a Level X Racing session as detailed in the Level X Racing Conditions, and the responsibilities of the officials.

Role	Number Required	Eligibility/Minimum Qualification	Responsibilities
Technical official	2	- Swim England member - British Swimming Judge 1	- Start the race - Act as chief timekeeper - Observe the race for any obvious rule infringements - ratify the results
Timekeepers	1 per racing lane	- Swim England member - Minimum of 14 years old on date of session - Can be another swimmer, a coach or anyone who is normally on pool deck for that session	- Record the name, distance, stroke and time for each swimmer - Inform the technical officials if their watch failed to start on the starting signal, and if they did not stop the watch when the swimmer touches at the finish

Health & Safety Considerations for Level X Racing Officials

As Level X Racing is designed to need minimal officials, it may be able to take place with only personnel who would usually be on pool deck during that session. Where additional people are needed to meet the officiating requirements the Risk Assessment must reflect this and the Covid-19 Lead should be aware.

Below are some additional health & safety considerations for Level X Racing sessions

- Where races are started with a whistle, this must be supplied by the individual who is acting as starter.
- Timekeepers must supply their own stopwatch and means of recording the time (pen, paper, clipboard)

Pre Requisite
